


ANDREW FINNIGAN WORKS

BERT FURNARI EASTON, PENNSYLVANIA, USA

Bert Furnari is a self taught designer who primarily works with aluminum. Everything starts with ½" thick sheets that are cut, welded, bent or otherwise manipulated into the (very stout and strong) works being shown. Every piece is unique. While similar, even a pair of side table will be two unique tables. The finish is powder-coated. Sometimes a color (or two), sometimes a color and a coat of clear over areas of natural aluminum that have been sanded, ground, polished or imbued with a pattern of sorts. For mirrors he hand cuts the glass to fit inside the recesses and uniformly sands the edges so there are no sharp bits to sting curious hands.

The unique finishing process allows for control of color without losing the grain's natural tactile quality.

Inspired by Duchamps's ready-mades and the mass production of plywood furniture, Charles Grantham explores the remaking of mass-produced commodity goods as an individual artistic expression dedicated to materiality and craft. He creates them with a sensitivity towards beauty and the innate aspects of materials themselves. By altering the material but keeping the manufacturing process the same, the process, rather than the object, becomes ready-made. This in turn results in a new object that is completely familiar and simultaneously completely different—in aesthetic appearance and mechanical properties—from plywood pieces previously created.

At the core of the collection is the alchemy between the innate raw and brutal character of the material, the idiosyncrasies of the handcrafted forms, and the purposefully slow casting methods used in the process of designing organic and intriguing shapes suitable for production. This combination of elements creates visually stimulating pieces that embrace the irregularities that make each one exceptional.








JOHN SHEPPARD STUDIO
